C.O. <sup>6</sup>/<sub>872</sub>.—The Commissioner of Police having reason to believe that in some cases members of the Force have resorted to the use of firearms under circumstances which did not justify their use, directs the attention of the Force generally to the following Rules relating to the use of arms by the Police.

#### USE OF ARMS BY POLICE.

The Police should always remember that they are a Civil and not a Military Force, and that it is under the exceptional circumstances existing in Western Australia that they are armed with deadly weapons to be used on rare and exceptional occasions.

The Police, in common with all other subjects of the Queen, are in no case permitted by law to use more force than is necessary for the effecting of a lawful purpose or the resisting of unlawful aggression. Though, when armed with a warrant, the Police have, as to the pursuit and capture of felons, greater powers than Her Majesty's other subjects, they are equally bound to remember this principle.

In reading the following rules offered for their guidance, the Police must clearly understand that the use of firearms with fatal effect is only justified in the last resort, when all other means, such as, for example, wounding or disabling, are exhausted, or are ineffectual, or impossible.

The Police are armed to enable them successfully to overcome opposition to lawful arrests, and to protect themselves against armed interference in the execution of their duty. It is therefore of the utmost importance that they should clearly understand under what circumstances they are justified in resorting to the use of the weapons with which they are entrusted.

- 2. It is only in the apprehension or detention of felons that a constable would be justified in proceeding to extremities, that is when the constable is armed with a warrant for a felony, or when, not having a warrant, a felony is committed within his own view or when he is in immediate pursuit of a person whom he knows to have committed a felony; and, in such cases, in order to make the resort to firearms justifiable, there must be an apparent necessity to which he must be reduced in arresting, or detaining the felon.
- 3. If a constable endeavor to apprehend a person who has committed a felony, or a person whom he is, by a proper warrant, authorised to apprehend for felony, and such person flies, knowing the intention to arrest for such felony, and with a view to prevent such arrest, he may be lawfully fired upon, provided he cannot be otherwise apprehended.

At what particular period of a struggle, or pursuit, the impossibility of overtaking the person flying becomes manifest must depend upon the circumstances of each case.

If the constable is better mounted than the person he is endeavoring to arrest, or the place where the parties are is such that assistance is likely to be obtained before the escape can be fully effected, or if in any other way there is reasonable ground for supposing that the arrest can be accomplished in that particular pursuit, the officer ought not, in any of those cases, to use firearms. He is not, however, bound to let a felon or person whom he is authorised by warrant to arrest for felony, escape from him because he may have reason to think that he can find him easily at some other time. It is his duty to arrest the person whom he is so authorised or commanded to arrest, as soon as he sees him, and, if he cannot otherwise overtake him, he may fire upon him. Constables ought, in all cases to be extremely cautious in resorting to such an extreme step as the use of firearms, but when neccesity occurs they must do their duty, and the law will protect them.

The preceding observations apply only to the case of an officer firing to prevent the escape of a felon. Should the officer be resisted, and his own life placed in jeopardy, he may then use firearms, not for the purpose of preventing an escape, but in self-defence.

- 4. A constable, in the execution of his duty, can fire upon a person who assaults and resists him; that is, he may repel force with force, and if the person resisting is unavoidably killed in a struggle, the constable is justified.
- 5. Where a felony has been committed, and the felon does not resist, but merely flies to avoid arrest, if the constable should pursue and injure or even kill him in the pursuit, when he cannot otherwise be taken, the constable is justified.
- 6. So if a felon, after an arrest, break away as he is being taken to gaol, and his pursuers cannot retake him without firing upon him, they are justified in doing so, but it must be known to them that the man is a felon.

- 7. A constable seeing a person running away with goods is not justified in shooting at such person, although he cannot arrest him without firing, unless he *knows* that he has committed a felony in taking such goods. It is not sufficient that such person had in fact so committed a felony.
- 8. If a person, having actually committed a felony, will not suffer himself to be arrested, but stands on his own defence, or fly so that he cannot possibly be apprehended alive by those who pursue him, with or without a warrant from the Magistrate, the constable in pursuit would be justified in firing upon him.
- 9. A Police Constable on duty at a gaol or any other place in which prisoners are confined, is justified in firing on any prisoner attempting to escape, who assaults or resists the constable endeavoring to retake or secure him, or on a prisoner convicted of felony, who persists in flying from the gaol or other place of confinement, when the use of firearms by the Police Constable is apparently a matter of necessity so that otherwise the prisoner will escape.
- 10. It is particularly impressed upon all officers of Police, that the above rules apply to cases of arrest and pursuit of aboriginal natives as well as of other criminals.
