MURDER.

£125 REWARD.

WHEREAS on the 27th November last, some human remains were found in a disused shaft of the Rose and Pearl Mine, Mount Magnet:

The body had been severed through the back below the ribs, the head severed from the trunk, and the limbs disjointed in a skilful manner with some sharp instrument. The skull, also, had a large fracture in the left temple, such as might be caused by an instrument similar to a tomahawk. The remains appear to be those of a man of about 45 years of age, about 5ft. 8in. high, low receding forehead, coarse reddish hair and beard, the latter about 1½in. long, finger nails carefully trimmed, hands apparently had not done hard work. The teeth mentioned below had been lost during life:—One upper front, and all double teeth right upper jaw, all of left upper jaw except two bicuspids; molars and one bicuspid, right lower jaw; one molar and one bicuspid left lower A portion of the remains were in a bran bag, the latter branded $\frac{w}{L}$ in green paint; another bran bag and a portion of an old calico tent were also found near. The body is estimated to have been dead three or four weeks. At an inquest held at Mount Magnet, on 6th December last, a verdict was returned that the deceased, name unknown, came to his death by being murdered:

Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Twenty-five pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will establish the identity of the deceased; and a further sum of One hundred pounds will be paid for such information as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons who committed the murder. And further, His Excellency the Governor will be advised to extend a Free Pardon to any accomplice who shall first give the required information; provided the informant be not the person who actually committed the murder.
