#### THIEVES AND SUSPECTED PERSONS.

C.O.  $\frac{1}{1002}$ .—The attention of officers in charge of districts is directed to the very lax manner in which the instructions contained in C.O.  $\frac{6}{1043}$  and  $\frac{12}{1201}$ , and Regulations 151 and 171, are carried out.

If a proper system of surveillance of criminals is to be maintained, it is absolutely necessary that their movements should be promptly reported to the officer in charge of the Criminal Investigation Branch.

To enable this to be done with accuracy, every effort must be made by members of the Force to make themselves acquainted with the persons and habits of all suspected persons residing in their beats or in their districts.

The return required by C.O.  $\frac{6}{10^4 \, 3}$  should be compiled with the greatest care, but it is not necessary to send in the same list each half-year, a summary of the changes in the list during that period being sufficient.
