Return of Prisoners to be discharged from Fremantle Prison during the Month of September, 1903.

#### LUNATICS' ESTATES.

The practice of deducting the cost of expenses incurred in the arrest and committal of lunatics to the Asylum at Fremantle has been declared illegal, and must therefore cease.

All moneys found in possession of an insane person on arrest must be forwarded intact, with such person, to the authorities at the Fremantle Asylum, and a proper receipt obtained therefor. Other property should, as far as possible, be protected by the police until instructions are received as to its disposal.

As provided in C.O.  $\frac{1}{100}$ , expenses prior to committal to an Asylum will be chargeable to police vote, while subsequent charges (except the escort's fare and subsistence allowance) will be borne by the Medical Department.

A statement of all charges involved in the arrest and conveyance of insane persons must be supplied to Chief Office.

C.O.  $\frac{31}{98}$  is hereby cancelled.

POSTAGE STAMP CASH BOOK.

A new form of Postage Stamp Cash Book has been issued for use at each station to which stamps have been supplied.

In this book must be recorded the value of stamps received and issued, showing in the Dr. column the amount of stamps received, and in the Cr. column the amounts expended. The names of persons to whom letters are posted or telegrams despatched must be shown, and the cost entered in the proper columns ("Correspondence" or "Telegrams"). The denomination of the stamps need not be shown.

The books now used for the purpose should be closed, and the balances carried forward to the new book, which should be opened on 1st October next. New forms of postage stamp returns, to replace P. 59, will be issued shortly.
