RESERVE FOR KANGAROOS.

("The Game Act, 1892," and Act 64 Vict., No. 33.)

1283 /08. PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, By His Excellency Sir Edward Albert
Stone, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor in and
over the State of Western Australia and
its Dependencies, etc., etc.

WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892" (55 Vict., No. 36), the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette to declare any one or more portions of the State, or any one or more localities, to be defined in such Proclamation, a Reserve for Native Game or any particular Native Game.

And whereas it is deemed desirable that "Kangaroos" shall be strictly preserved within the portion of the State hereinafter more particularly described: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare all that portion of the State situate partly in the Eastern and partly in the South-West Division thereof, and more particularly described in the Schedule heavets a Reserve for Kongaroes. described in the Schedule hereto, a Reserve for Kangaroo

PROCLAMATION 1283/08.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA,) By His Excellency Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., E. A. STONE, Lieutenant-Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Game Act Amendment Act, 1907," it is provided that the Governor may, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, prohibit the taking or killing of native game generally, or in any defined portion of the State by any person who is not the holder of a license granted under that Act, or the use of any instrument or means for the purpose of killing, destroying, or taking native game: Now therefore I, Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit generally throughout the State out the State

- (c.) The killing or taking for sale or barter of kangaroos by any person who is not a holder of a license granted under "The Game Act Amendment Act, 1907," and
- (b.) The use of any instrument or means, except a gun fired from the shoulder, for the purpose of killing, destroying, or taking wild duck of any species.




