

THE following Revised Regulations for the Dress of the Police Force of the Colony, having received the approval of His Excellency the Administrator, are published for general information and guidance, and are to be strictly adhered to throughout the Service.

Dress Regulations for the Police Force of Western Australia.

ALL Officers are required to provide themselves with a proper outfit of uniform, and such other neces-saries as are required by the Regulations.

Sub-Inspectors receive an annual allowance of £8 towards the cost of their uniform. Detective Constables receive an annual allowance of £5, in lieu of clothing. Sub-Officers and Constables will be supplied with the following uniform, which must not be converted into private clothing, nor be altered in any way from the uniform pattern: --

SUB-OFFICERS.

1 blue cloth full dress suit	every 5 years.
1 undress suit—cloth or serge 1 holland or flannel coat & vest 1 cap or helmet (as required)	each year.
1 great coat 1 waterproof coat	every 4 years.

CONSTABLES.

1 tunic—cloth or serge

Should any Sub-Officer or Constable resign or be dismissed within 6 months after the issue of any article of uniform clothing, such clothing is to be returned into store.

Officers in charge of Districts and Sub-Districts, when making requisitions for clothing, will see that accurate measurements are forwarded, otherwise the contractor for clothing cannot be held responsible for misfits.

The full dress is to be worn by all members of the force on the following occasions:—

When on attendance as escort to His Excellency the Governor.

When on duty at the Legislative Council.

When on duty at the Supreme Court.

At all public entertainments or ceremonies under the patronage of His Excellency the Governor.

No exception is allowed to this rule in the case of members of the force acting as Clerks of Courts, &c.

It will, however, occasionally be expedient that the mounted police appear in bush dress on occasions when full dress is to be worn by the foot police.

Officers should never appear out of uniform on public occasions, or when attending Courts of Law. They will also, as a general rule, wear uniform at all times, save when off duty.

Any uniform with which members of the force provide themselves must be in strict accordance, both as regards pattern and quality, with the sealed patterns.

Whenever any constable's uniform shall be observed to be in an improper state, the Officer under whom he is serving shall have the power to order him to provide whatever article he may require, the order being, of course, subject to the approval of the Officer in charge of the district.

With reference to the claims of members of the force for reimbursement of expenses incurred in consequence of their clothing or uniform being damaged or destroyed in the execution of their duty, the following instructions are to be observed:—

Where any amount is awarded to a member of the force by a bench of magistrates or other judicial authority, as costs to reimburse him for damage to his clothing or uniform, and payment of it is made by the prisoner, defendant, or other person, the member of the force may receive the amount. In that case there will be no charge upon any Government vote.

But when the prisoner or other person chargeable either refuses to pay the amount and suffers imprisonment instead, or is unable to pay, an application should be submitted on the part of the member, for reimbursement. It must not, however, be understood that the applicant will necessarily be considered entitled to the same amount as that awarded by the Court; all that the applicant is in any case entitled to expect, is a reimbursement of the actual amount of the loss sustained.

Officers in charge, therefore, must estimate for themselves the extent of the damage and consequent amount of the loss, and submit a voucher accordingly. Where the garment is not rendered totally unserviceable, that amount will, of course, be the expense of repairing it; but when the garment has been totally destroyed, they must inquire how long it has been previously in wear, and from that time, taken in connection with the time a garment of the kind, under ordinary circumstances, would last, they will be able to judge what proportion of the price of a new garment they should recommend.

The same rule will apply in cases which do not come before a bench of magistrates or other court.

Badges of rank will be worn on shoulder straps, and in certain cases on saddle cloths, and are to be embroidered—on shoulder lin. high; on saddle cloth, 2½ in. high.

Boots and Spurs.—Mounted officers wear, when on mounted duties, knee boots with crane-necked spurs fastened with straps and buckles. Officers who are not mounted wear Wellington or ankle boots. The knee boot, which is sloped down at the back, should reach the front to about 4 in. from the top of the knee, and at the back just to the top of the calf.

Braid, Buttons, &c.—Unless otherwise specified, loops, frogs, and buttons on the front of tunics, &c., will be at equal distances. Buttons generally will be an inch in diameter; small buttons ³/₄ of an inch. When loops of lace or cord are worn across the breast, the top loops will reach to the sleeve seams, and those at the waist will be 4in. long.

Collars.—The collars of tunics and jackets will, unless otherwise stated, be rounded at the top in front. The height of the collar of the tunic is not to exceed 2in.

Depth of Skirt-9in.

Forage Caps will be round, and 3 inches high, with peaks.

Gloves. - White leather.

Great Coats and Capes.—Except when otherwise ordered, of milled cloth, according to military pattern; for foot or mounted officers badges of rank in silver.

Helmets.—Blue cloth, military Home pattern, with plated spike, cross pieces, roses, curb chain, &c.

Helmet, White.—Military pattern.

Plates.—Dimensions, Military Regulation.

Patrol Jacket.—Except when otherwise specified, according to Military Regulation pattern.

Saddle.—Hunting, with knee rolls.

Shoulder Straps are worn on tunics, patrol jackets, and great coats.

Swords.—Military Regulation.

Whistle and Chain, as for Officers of Rifle Regiments.

DESCRIPTION OF DRESS.

COMMISSIONER.

Tunic.—Blue cloth, edged all round, except the collar and cuffs, with black square cord; black velvet collar and cuffs. The collar edged with ½ inch black braid, with figured braiding below the lace, on the collar. The cuffs pointed with 1½ inch black lace round the top of the cuff, with figured braiding above and below the lace, extending to eleven inches from the bottom of the cuff (as for the King's Royal Rifle Corps), the skirt rounded off in front, closed behind and lined with black. On each side of the breast, 5 loops of black square cord with netted caps and drops, fastening with black olivets. On each back seam, a line of the same cord forming 3 eyes at the top, passing under a netted cap at the waist, below which it is doubled, and ending in an Austrian knot reaching to the bottom of the skirt; shoulder straps of black chain gimp, with small button of departmental pattern at the top. Badge of rank in silver.

Braid.-Black mohair.

Buttons.—Plated, special pattern.

Badges.—Silver embroidery pattern.

Trousers, &c.—Blue cloth, with 2 inch black braid down the side seams.

Wellington Boots and Steel Spurs.

Pantaloons, &c.—For mounted service—Blue cloth, with stripes as on the cloth trousers. Knee boots with steel spurs.

Helmet.—Blue cloth, same as "Military Home Pattern," with plated curb chain on blue morocco leather.

Helmet Plate.—Silver, special pattern.

Helmet, White.—Same as "Military Regulation Pattern," with plated curb chain on buff leather.

Sword.—Half basket, steel hilt, with two fluted bars on the outside; black fish skin grip, bound with silver wire; slightly curved blade, 35in. long, and 1½in. wide at the shoulder, grooved and spear pointed.

Scabbard.—Steel, with a large shoe at the bottom and a trumpet-shaped mouth.

Sword Knot.—Silver cord, with a silver acorn.

Sword Belt.—Black patent leather, 1½in. wide, with slings an inch wide; silver snake clasp and mounting.

Pouch Belt.—Black patent leather, 27/8 in. wide, with silver breast ornament as for helmet plate, whistle and chain, silver ornamented buckle and slide.

Pouch.—Black patent leather, with silver device on the leaf similar to that on the helmet.

Sabretache.—Black leather, with three slings, device on flap similar to that on the helmet.

Gloves.—White leather.

Patrol Jacket.—Blue cloth, black velvet collar and cuffs. Black mohair inch braid, traced with black Russia braid down the front, on the top of the cuffs, and along the back seams; ½-inch mohair braid, traced with black Russia braid, at the top and bottom of collar showing facings. The tracing forms a crow's foot and eye on the bottom. On each side in front, five loops of black round cord, with caps and drops fastening with black olivets. Shoulder straps with badges of rank as for tunic.

Forage Cap.—Blue cloth, round, 3 inches high, with band of 2 inch silver oak-leaf lace, and device similar to that on helmet plate, embroidered in front. Black patent leather drooping peak. The peak ornamented with ½-inch silver embroidery, silver purl button and braided figure on the crown, plain black chin strap and oilskin cover.

* Forage Cap—for active service.—Blue cloth folding cap, 5 inches high, with blue cloth side flaps, 4 inches deep, to turn down when required, silver French braid welts on cap and flaps and at front and back seams, silver cord boss on left side.

• It will be optional for the officers to provide themselves with "Forage caps for active service."

† Shell Jacket.—Blue cloth, black velvet collar and cuffs; black mohair braid all round the body, forming barrels (or dummies) at bottom of back seams; back seams trimmed with a double row of \(\frac{1}{3}\)-inch mohair braid, forming a crow's foot at each end and in centre; five waved loops of square cord in front, with four rows of knitted olivets, two olivets on each loop; pointed

† It will be optional for the Officers to provide themselves with Shell Jackets and Mess Waistcoats. cuffs of inch mohair braid, with tracing of black Russia braid, forming a row of small eyes on the outside and inside of the cuffs, and extending $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches from the bottom of each cuff; mohair braid, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch wide, all round the collar, trimmed through centre with plumes and row of small eyes along top edge, a loop at bottom of collar to fasten across the neck; shoulder straps, with badges of rank, as for tunic.

Mess Waistcoat.—Blue cloth, single breasted, no collar, open half way down, hooks and eyes, \frac{1}{2}-inch mohair braid on edges, with a \frac{1}{4}-inch braid down the front, one inch from the edge; black velvet between the two braids, with row of eyes of black Russia braid down front edge on the black velvet; pockets trimmed with \frac{1}{4}-inch mohair braid, forming a crow's foot at each end, edged all round with scarlet cloth.

Great Coat and Cape.—Milled cloth, double-breasted. to reach the ankle, when worn on foot; stand and fall collar, $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches deep, with a fly to cover the band of the cape when buttoned on; loose round cuffs, 6 inches deep; 2 pockets, with flaps, at the waist, in front; 2 opening behind at the side seams, with pointed flaps, 11 inches long; a pocket inside the left breast; a slit in the left side for the sword to pass through; an opening behind, with a fly, the opening to be long enough to reach to the cantle of the saddle, and a gusset introduced com-mencing at the top of the slit and extending downwards to about 24 inches, both about 19 inches width at the bottom. A tab with button hole at the bottom of the gusset to close it when the coat is worn on foot, 2 rows of buttons down the front, 6 in each row, the top buttons 6 inches apart, the bottom ones 4 inches; 3 buttons on each skirt flap, the centre one to close the pocket; 4 small buttons at the openings behind; and 5 flat buttons under the fly at the collar. A cloth back strap attached to the top button of the skirt flap, to confine the coat at the waist; 2 hooks and eyes to the collar. Shoulder straps of the same material as the coat. A small button at the top. Badge of rank, in silver. Cape of same cloth as the coat and long enough to cover the knuckles, 4 small buttons in front, to fasten at the neck with a leather strap runner and buckle. Four cloth tabs with button holes in the lining at the bottom, one on either side in front and two in the rear, so as to secure the cape to the bottom buttons of the coat in front and to the top buttons on the flaps behind. In the coat a small pocket with a flap at the back of the left sleeve. On the inside of each skirt, a cloth band with button to secure the skirts over the knees when the coat is worn on mounted duties.

It will be optional for Sub-Inspectors to provide themselves with Great Coats.

HORSE FURNITURE.

Saddle.—Hunting; plain stirrups and blue girths.

Saddle Cloth.—Blue cloth, 3 feet long at the bottom and two feet deep, with black mohair lace, an inch wide. Badges of rank embroidered in silver on the hind corners.

Bridle.—Brown leather, Military Staff pattern, with plain plated bosses, blue front and rosettes, steel chain reins.

OFFICERS.

The uniform and horse furniture are the same as for the Commissioner, with the following exceptions:—

Tunic.—Collar and cuffs of same material as garment Superintendents have a row of braided eyes below the lace on the collar, and an Austrian knot of black square cord on the sleeve, with a tracing of braided eyes all round it, extending to 8in. from the bottom of the cuff.

Inspectors have a tracing of plain braid only, below the lace on the collar, and Austrian knot on the sleeve, with a tracing of plain braid round it, extending to 7in. only from the bottom of the cuff.

Sub-Inspectors have no braid below the lace on the collar, and no tracing round the Austrian knot, on the sleeve.

Sub-Inspectors need only provide themselves with undress uniform, the provision of any further article being left optional, until promotion to the rank of Inspector.

Patrol Jacket.— Collar and cuffs, same material as garment, without tracing of black Russia braid on front, collar and cuffs, and back seams.

Trousers.—Superintendents have 1½in, black braid down the side seam.

Inspectors and Sub-Inspectors have 1in, black braid down the seam.

Shell Jacket.—Collar and cuffs same material as garment.

Sword-Knot.—Buff leather, with silver acorn.

Sabretaches.—Not worn by officers.

Forage Cap.—Superintendents and Inspectors have band of 1½in, silver oak-leaf lace. No figure on crown.

Sub-Inspectors have band of lin. silver oak-leaf lace, plain black peak.

Saddle Cloths.—Without badge of rank.

SUB-OFFICERS.

Tunic.—Sub-Officers.—Blue cloth, loose, with standup collar, braided round edges of collar and tunic with ½in. black braid, fastened with 5 barrel buttons. Shoulder knots of twisted silver cord.

Chevrons.—Sergeants will wear three silver chevrons, surmounted by a crown on each sleeve, below the elbow.

Corporals will wear two silver chevrons surmounted by silver crown on each sleeve, below elbow.

Trousers.—Blue cloth with single black stripe down sides, for sergeants; plain, for corporals.

Cap.—French peak, with three rows of ½in. silver lace on band, for sergeants, and two rows of ½in. silver lace for corporals. Badge—silver crown in front.

Great Coat.—Double-breasted, with stand-up collar and departmental buttons (metal).

Sword Belt.—Brown leather, $1\frac{1}{2}$ in, wide, with slings, an inch wide, with metal S hook fastening.

Pouch Belt.—Brown leather, with metal crown.

Pouch.—Brown leather, with metal crown.

Gloves .- White cotton.

Sub-Officers in charge of stations will be distinguished by metal crowns on the collar.

CONSTABLES.

Tunic.—Blue cloth, loose, with stand-up collar, 5 metal buttons down the front, black braid round edge of collar and coat, shoulder straps of same material as garment, braided round edge with ¹/₄ inch braid, except at base, with small metal button at top.

Trousers.—Dark blue cloth. Breeches for mounted constables, white moleskin in town, drab cord at outstations and in the bush.

Boots.—For mounted constables, knee boots in accordance with sealed pattern.

Cap.—French peak with band of 1 inch white mohair braid, and crown in front.

Cap Covers.—Waterproof.

Helmet.—For summer, white pith.

Summer Clothing.—Holland tunic and drill trousers or blue flannel tunic and trousers, in accordance with sealed pattern, will be worn by all ranks during the summer months (1st October to 31st March).

Great Coats.—Double breasted, stand-up collar, with departmental buttons.

Belts for Great Coats.—Black leather, with white metal buckle.
