Miscellaneous.

Mount Gould.—On the 29th September last, the skeletons of a man and dog were found about three miles south of Clifton Downs homestead. The human remains are described as those of an old European male of tall stature, feet deformed from use of tight boots, and hands those of a man unaccustomed to hard work; teeth drawn. The dog was probably a young cross-bred animal, with light coloured smooth coat, and of medium size. The coloured smooth coat, and of medium size. The body of the man was lying on the left side and bore the remnants of a cotton shirt, moleskin trousers, and blucher boots, the latter being little worn, right boot being cut away at heel, evidently on account of sore. These remains appeared to have been on the spot about 8 or 10 months. There is no suspicion of foul play. It is surmised that the human remains are those of James Kerwin, lately working as cook at shearing time at Annean and other stations. He is described as an old man, thin and spare, about 6ft. high, with grey hair and whiskers, formerly of the Royal Engineers; afterwards schoolmaster; a well informed man, but given to drink; called himself Kerwen of Kerwen Castle, Ireland, and said he was close of kin to a title.
