



### Murder.

On the 27th mst, the remains of a man were found in the Rose and Pearl Mine, Mount Magnet. Death had evidently been caused by a blow on the left temple with a sharp instrument such as a tomahawk. The body had been dismembered in a neat and accurate manner, and the limbs after amputation again disjointed at the knees and elbows. The body and head were found in a different part of the workings to the place where the limbs were found; the lower part of the body is still missing.
