Maddock, Sophia Margaret (nee Krabbe)	28 September 1868, Victoria	1924.	Came to W.A. in mid 1890s. Met George Maddock. Married him in St Georges Cathedral, Perth, 2 February 1897. A son born 1898, later a daughter. Stayed alone for days.
Madow, Bertha Clyde (nee Lally)			Lived her early life in Northam, went to Cunderdin 1908. Settled on property and farmed for many years.
Magner, Sarah (nee Gawdrey)	1875	1950	Wife of John Magner. Pioneer of Ongerup 1911.
