Had 7 children, 19 grandchildren, 11 great grandchildren helped celebrate diamond wedding anniversary at their home "Hillside". Was a deaconess and Sunday school teacher for about 52 years.
Sermon, Mary			Married William Sermon 1860. Lived first in North West, then took up land at Grass Valley.
Severin, Marianna			Married and settled in Woodanilling district 1902
Sewell, Mrs Christina			One of 1 <sup>st</sup> students of Claremont Training College. 1 <sup>st</sup> woman land agent in Australia

She carried on farm herself until eldest son, Fred, who was 8 when father died, was able to take it over.
Shackley, Bertha Caroline			Arrived with her parents from SA 1894. Resided on farm in Woodanilling district for 60 years.
Shalders, Catherine Jane	1868	1963	Born England. Arrived Albany 1890, went to Northam. Died Perth, aged 95 years.
Shalders, Emily			Came from England 1925. Married in Perth 1927. Pioneer of Newdegate before railway – used to travel to Lake Grace, 38 miles by horse and cart, took several days.
Shankland, Elizabeth Annie			Pioneer of Manmanning. Settled on virgin land 1927.

Sheppard, Mrs			Pioneer of Dudawa (Three Springs-Arrino district), took up virgin land 1906. Mother of 12 children, all born without doctor. Nearest water 2½ miles, very muddy. Lived in 2-roomed tin house, earth floors, cooked outside on camp fire or brick oven. Lamps made by ½ filling tin with sand, putting fat on top, rag as wick. When dam put down, children, clothes, food loaded in spring cart for general washing day, both clothes and children.
Sherlock, Vivien Mabel			Pioneered Bodallin 1924. Opened 1 <sup>st</sup> school in her own home, later in a new building in township.
Shepherdson, Fannie T.		1958	Wife of Bert Wm. Shepherdson, married Mundijong 1899, 4 sons
