

TERRY, Theodosia Mary (nee Welch)

Theodosia Mary Welch (1837-1862) left England on the clipper ship Ballarat in March 1855 to marry Leonard Terry, Architect, on arrival in Melbourne. They were married on 26 June 1855 and had six children: Leonard, Kenyon, Emily, Henry, Marmaduke, and Margaret. Theodosia's journal, in which she recorded events over the period 16 March to 1 August 1855, was copied by her granddaughter, Ellen Rees (nee Terry), who was born in Western Australia in 1905, daughter of Theodosia and Leonard's youngest son, Marmaduke, Surveyor, and his second wife, Filumina Mary Terry (1876-1944), daughter of Alfred and Ellen Bussell.

5716A/1	16 March 1855 – 1 August 1855	Daily record of the life of Theodosia Mary Terry (nee Welch) on board Ballarat en route from England to Melbourne, where she married Leonard Terry, Architect, on 26 June 1855. The journal was continued until 1 August 1855. Leonard Terry took part in designing St Paul's Cathedral in Melbourne. Theodosia Mary Terry died in 1862.
