

**WHITTINGTON, Vera May (nee Slade) 1915-2013**

Vera was a writer and historian whose publications include: *Gold and Typhoid – Two Fevers; a social history of Western Australia*, *Sister on Patrol : from the missionary experiences of Sister Dorothy Pederick*, *Sister Kate: a life dedicated to children in need of care & Rowethorpe writings, a selection*. Vera also wrote for radio and school broadcast dramas in the 1970s, as well as articles for various journals.
