

Hall's Creek.—A mining district on Kimberley goldfield of which it is the official centre. Post, T., and M.O.O., monthly mail via Wyndham.

Hamelin.—See Augusta.

Hamelin Pool (Shark's Bay).—Post and telegraph station.

Hannan's.—About 25 miles in a North-Easterly direction from Coolgardie.

Harvey.—A railway station on S.W. ry. 86 miles from Perth, fares 14s. 4d. and 9s.; ret. 21s. 6d. and 13s. 6d. Churches: C.E. serv. Post Office. Agricultural.

Hay River Road.—A siding on G.S. ry. 27 miles from Albany, fares 4s. 6d. and 3s. 5d.; ret. 6s. 9d. and 5s. 2d.

Israelite Bay.—On S. coast about 120 miles E. of Esperance Bay. Post and telegraph office, monthly mail. Pastoral.

Jandakot.—An agricultural area about 10 to 12 miles from Perth and Fremantle. Approach from Perth via Cannington and Nicholson rd.; from Fremantle via Forrest rd.

Jarrahdale.—A timber station connected by private railway with port of Rockingham. Jarrahdale is situated 7 miles from Jarrahdale Junction on S.W. ry. 29 miles from Perth; fares, Perth to Junction, 4s. 10d. and 3s.; ret. 7s. 3d. and 4s. 6d. Churches: C.E. serv., R.C., Pres. serv. Kimberley Goldfield in N.E. corner of the colony. Mount Baker.—A district with platform on E. ry. 46 miles from Perth.
