Separate and Complete Directories of Medical, Ecclesiastical, Legal, Educational, Banking, Insurance, Mining, Pastoral and Agricultural, Local Government, Customs and Official, and Postal and Telegraphic, are given, making the work unique in its comprehensiveness, fullness and accuracy.

In conclusion, the Publishers beg to state that in future the work will be issued Annually; this they do at the request of a very large number of their Subscribers, and also as they find it necessary to keep pace with the alterations and additions consequent on the continued influx of population.
