The Government grant assisted passages to Western Australia to nominated female immigrants, upon the payment of £7 10s. per adult by sailing vessel; children under 12 years are half price. Fees by steamer are extra, viz., by "Orient" line about £70 7s. or by direct steamer to Fremantle about £5 5s. Nomination forms are obtainable at the office of the Honourable the Colonial Secretary in Perth Assisted passages are at present only allowed to farmers, agriculturists, millers, wheelwrights & others likely to be useful in country districts, all of

whom must be possessed of some small capital. The amount required in each case is decided by the Agent General, & must be deposited with him. As a rule a single man is required to deposit not less than £100
