BARRISTERS' BOARD.

(57 Vic., No. 12.)

MEMBERS.—The Attorney General & the Crown Solicitor, *ex officio*; Hon. S. Burt, R. W. Poun-father & R. S. Haynes, as King's Counsels; Mr. J. A. Northmore, Mr. T. P. Draper, Mr. R. R. Pilkington, Mr. C. B. Cox & Mr. H. W. Hensman, elected members.

Secretary—Mr. Reginald H. Goodman.

This board is established by virtue of "The Legal Practitioners' Act, 1893," and has power to regulate and control the examination and admission of articled clerks and the examination of all candi-dates for admission to the Bar of the State. The certificate of the board is necessary before any person can be admitted to practise.

Clerks are required to pass the usual preliminary examination in General Knowledge, and to serve articles for a period of five years, or in the case of a person who has taken a degree in any British or Colonial University, a period of three years.

Barristers and Solicitors of England or Ireland, and Writers to the Signet and Solicitors of the Supreme Court of Scotland, are entitled to be admitted to the courts of this State, and also Solicitors admitted in any colony where (i.) the law is similar to that administered in this State, (ii.) service under articles of examination is required, and (iii.) where practitioners of the Supreme Court of Western Australia are entitled to be admitted; reside for 6 months in the State and satisfy the board of his fitness, lodge with the Secretary for five months his papers in complete form, advertise for one month notice of his application, and pay the board 30 guineas. On admission a stamp fee of £10 is payable. The advertising charges amount to six guineas.

The board has power to inquire into complaints against practitioners for illegal, unprofessional, negligent, dishonest or extortionate conduct, and to make a report to the court thereon. The court awards such punishment or otherwise on the report as it may think fit.

Applicants for admission must be present in court when motion is made.
