FEDERAL CUSTOMS TARIFF OF AUSTRALIA.

As we go to press the Tariff is being debated in Parliament. To give the proposed tariff would be misleading, as undoubtedly many alterations and reductions will be made.

DUTY ON CIRCULARS.—The customs duty leviable in Western Australia on circulars, price lists, and other printed papers, may be paid by the senders directly to the Deputy Postmaster General at Perth. The Federal Authorities advise exporters to weigh the articles in bulk before posting, assess the duty at 3d. per lb., and remit the amount in a letter stating for what reason they make the payment. The covers of the articles should be stamped with the name and address of the sender, and a statement that the duty has been sent to the Deputy Postmaster General, Perth. This inscription may appear on the addressed side of the cover, provided it is confined to the left hand half. Senders should note that even one circular only will be duty charged on arrival if not thus provided for.
