LEASES: Any lease made in perpetuity, or for a term of years, or for a period determinable with one or more lives, or otherwise contingent, in consideration of a sum of money paid in the way of premium, fine, or the like, if without rent—a stamp equal in amount to the transfer duty payable on the sale of land for a sum equal to the amount of the consideration.			
Lease of any lands or tenements at a rent, without any payment of any sum of money by way of fine or premium—			
firstly, when the lease is for a period not exceeding one year; secondly, when the lease is for a period exceeding one year & not exceeding three years; thirdly, when the lease is for a period exceeding three years, require to be validated by stamps as follows:—

In the above system the department undertakes to deliver registered articles sent by parcel post and to recover from the addressees on delivery the specified sum of money fixed by the sender,			
and to remit the same to the sender by money order, for which the usual commission will be charged.			
In addition to the ordinary postage, a registration fee of 3d. will be charged and a commission for collecting, amounting to 2d. on sums not exceeding 10/- and 1d. for each additional 5/- or fraction of 5/-, which fees must be affixed to parcels by means of postage stamps.			
Postage and limit of weight same as ordinary parcel post.
