DISTRICT ROAD BOARDS.

Roads.—The roads of the State, outside of Municipalities, are under the charge of District Road Boards, who have powers under the "Roads Act" similar to those given to Local Government Bodies in the other States. A good number of roads, however, on Goldfields where water supply is a principal factor, are constructed and maintained by Mines Water Supply Dept. The main stock routes, of which the water supply is principal and ruling factor—passing through centre of State—are constructed and maintained at considerable cost, owing to their great length and remoteness, by the Mines and Public Works Depts. Road Boards are authorised to levy a general rate on property within their district not exceeding 1s. 6d. in the £ in any one year when annual value basis is adopted as basis of valuation, or 2½d. in the £ when the unimproved capital value is adopted, with option to adopt a minimum value of 2s. 6d. on every one allotment.

Boards consist of seven persons, inclusive of the Chairman, whom the members choose from amongst themselves, and are elected by ballot by the ratepayers in the district whose names are on the Road Board electoral list. Each elector has a proportionate number of votes to the rateable value of the property owned or occupied by him in the district. Districts may be divided into wards, in which cases the Minister may increase number of members to nine. When districts are divided into wards, each elector has proportionate number of votes to rateable value of property owned or occupied by him in each ward.

Boards control smaller towns, such as Kutanning, Bridgetown, Moora, Sandstone, Bulong, &c.

The Road Boards are charged with the collection of Cart and Carriage, Camel, Dog and other licenses, also Executive Duties of "Cart and Carriage Act," "Dog Act" and "Width of Tyres Act," also "Parks and Reserves Act," so far as it deals with Reserves under their control, and the control of water supplies along roads which are principally constructed by Works Dept. and handed over to Local Boards who control same. Other executive powers are also granted to Boards for controlling matters under their jurisdiction, such as Electric Lighting, Drainage, Noxious Weeds and other Acts, as well as having to contribute towards Hospitals, Fire Brigades, &c.

The whole of the Administration of the funds voted by Parliament for roads and bridges, as well as the "Roads Act" and "Width of Tyres Act" and other matters in connection with the Road Boards, is under the control of the Public Works Dept. (F. L. Stronach, Under Secretary). Clerk-in-charge: A. E. Sanderson; Auditors: H. J. Ash and G. D. E. Plunkett; Searcher, J. J. O'Neill.
