INCOME TAX.

The rates of Income Tax in the £ on
 the income chargeable are graduated
 being 2d. up to the first £100 income
 chargeable; £0/7d on £101; 2.014d on
 £102, and so on, increasing by
 regular increments of .007d with
 every increase of £1 in the income
 chargeable, until the rate reaches 4/-
 in the £, namely on £8672. There
 after the rate is 4/- uniformly; some-
 times 1/3. When the net income
 exceeds £264, there is a super-tax of
 15 per cent. to be added

 makes a charge of 2d in the £ with
 a minimum charge of 4d. This
 amount is charged to the remitter in
 addition to the ordinary commission

Week-end Cable Letters
 (liable to suspension from time to time)
 Week-end cable letters may be ex-
 changed between the Commonwealth
 and the United Kingdom, &c. and
 they shall be subject to the rules as
 deferred telegrams, with the exception
 that they shall be delivered on Tuesday
 morning, or, if practicable, on Mon-
 day. Week-end cable letters shall be
 transmitted by telegraph throughout,
 except in the case of those intended
 for onward transmission by post from
 the telegraph office of destination in
 the United Kingdom or Canada to
 other countries. The prefix "TWT" is
 to be included in the address, and
 charged for as one word.
