INCOME TAX.

The rates of Income Tax in the £2 on the income chargeable are graduated being 2d. up to the first £100 income chargeable; 2.007d on £101; 2.014d on £102, and so on, increasing by regular increments of .007d with every increase of £1 in the income chargeable, until the rate reaches 1/ after the rate is 4/- uniformly; rates of tax subject to 20% rebate; companies 1/3, plus 15 per cent super tax

Financial Emergency Tax ranges from 4d to 9d in £, persons with dependant earning under £3/12/- and person without dependant earning under £78 p.a exempt

Hospital Contribution, person under £52 or over, 1/4d in £1

For parcels posted to New South Wales and South Australia and other places within the Commonwealth, 1/3 for the first pound and 9d for each additional pound up to 3lbs; 4 & 5lbs, 3/6; 6, 7 & 8lbs, 5/-; 9, 10 & 11lbs, 7/3.
