Missing Friends.

LAMONT HENRY GREEME YOUNG, of the Sydney Government Mines Department (Associate of the London Royal School of Mines and Fellow of the Geological Society), arrived on the 8th October, 1880, at Bermagin on the sea coast 185 miles south of Sydney, N.S.W., in the steamer "Truganini." On the 10th October, he embarked between 7 and 8 a.m. in a boat with the intention of crossing the bay to Corunna Point with 4 other men, since which time they have not been seen or heard of. Description: muscular frame, about 5ft. 10in. high, fair complexion, blue grey eyes, auburn beard and moustache, fair hair, high wide forehead, has a mark like a small tea leaf on the back under left shoulder, and a front tooth with half a false one screwed into it. At 4 p.m. the same day the boat was discovered on the shore at Corunna Point, with three large holes broken in her sides; there were found on shore the remains of a meal eaten, and ends of cigars, also a cigar holder of Mr. Young's, 2 of the mens hats, and a boot was also found. Several articles belonging to Mr. Young were found in the boat, which leads to the belief that the party landed at Corunna Point and have been kidnapped and taken on board some vessel.
