No. 21, 17th May, 1882.

On the 17th January, 1882, the headless body of a man was found near the Deep Lead Railway Station, Stawell, and at an inquest, held subsequently, it was shown that the man had been wilfully murdered. The remains are believed to be those of one Charles Forbes or Forbys, who worked on the Dimboola line of railway during the months of October, November, and December, 1881, with a man named Robert Francis Burns. The said Robert Francis Burns has since been arrested, and committed for trial at the Central Criminal Court, to be held at Melbourne on the 15th day of August, 1882, for the murder of Charles Forbes or Forbys; but as the prisoner alleges that Forbes is still alive, it is requested that the said Charles Forbes or Forbys, if living, or any person acquainted with him, or able to give information about him since the date of his disappearance, should at once communicate with the Chief Commissioner of Police, Melbourne. Description of the missing man, Charles Forbes, is as follows:—About 40 years of age, 5ft. $10\frac{1}{2}$ or 11 inches high, 14 stone weight, full sandy beard, and hair a shade darker, supposed to be a native of the North of Ireland.
