# Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. <sup>6</sup>/<sub>074</sub>.—His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve the following arrangements relative to the Police Force (Land and Water) at Fremantle, and in the Fremantle Police Sub-District, to be brought into operation on the 1st March next:—

The undermentioned appointments are to be abolished—

Sub-Inspector of Water Police.

Corporal of Land Police.

Corporal of Detective Department.

The Land Police at Fremantle will consist of one Sergeant and eight Constables, and one First Class Detective, and the Water Police of one Coxswain and six Constables.

The whole of this Force (Land and Water), together with the Police at the Rockingham, Mandurah, and Pinjarrah Stations, will be under the immediate charge and orders of a Sub-Inspector of Police, whose head quarters will be at Fremantle.

This officer will communicate direct with the Superintendent of Police, and with the Sub-Inspector in charge of the Detective Department, in all matters that concern that department and require prompt attention.

The Sub-Inspector will receive a salary of £190 per annum, and an allowance of £25 per annum if not provided with quarters.

The Coxswain of Water Police will, in addition to his present Water Police salary, receive an allowance of £25 per annum for enforcing the provisions of "The Passenger Act."

The placing the First Class Detective stationed at Fremantle under the immediate orders of the Sub-Inspector in charge of the Fremantle Sub-District is not to interfere in any way with his carrying out promptly any orders he may receive from the Sub-Inspector in charge of the Detective Department at Perth.
