Murder.

On the 11th inst., the remains of a human body were found in a marlock thicket at Tumpup, 60 miles from Kojonup. The body had been partly burned in a fire, only portions of backbone, hip, liver, part of shoulder blade, and several small bones and pieces of skull were recovered. The remains are believed to be those of James Watson, exp., late 7582, alias Pigman, who has been missing from Yellenup, 60 miles North-east of Kojonup, since the 1st inst. Watson was last seen by Frederick Baker, on the 1st inst., when he stated he was going to look round his sandalwood. He was then dressed in blue dungaree trowsers and jumper, and black billycock hat, and was riding a brown mare with chesnut foal at side, and had an old saddle and bridle and rug. The mare and foal were found at Haywood's, on the 3rd inst., with a tether rope dragging. A pair of boots with the tops cut off, believed to be those worn by Watson, were found buried a short distance from the Watson, were round burled a short distance from the fire. John Maroney, t.l., Reg. No. 9514, and Wm. Watkins, exp., late 5666, have been arrested on suspicion; the saddle, bridle, and rug are still missing. Immediate inquiry is to be made police throughout the Colony, and the utmost deavors made to ascertain if James Watson, exp., late 7582, *alias* Pigman, is still alive.
