# Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. 6/000.—The Superintendent of Police notifies, for the information of the Police throughout the Colony, that from the 1st of January, 1884, the undermentioned articles of Uniform Clothing will be issued to the members of the Police Force, free of charge:

Sergeants 1 Full Dress Suit Every Five Years 1 Great Coat Every Four Years 1 Undress Suit, Cloth or	
Corporals.  Tweed  Holland Coat and Vest Cap or Helmet  Each Year	
(1 Great Coat Every Four Years	
Constables 1 Suit, Cloth or Tweed 1 Holland Tunic 1 Cap or Helmet 1 Pair of Cord Breeches	
to Mounted Constables in lieu of trousers	

Should any Member of the Force resign or be dismissed the Force within six months after the issue of any article of Uniform Clothing, such Clothing will have to be returned into store.

Sub-Inspectors who have to furnish themselves with the New Regulation Uniform, including Great Coats, will receive £8 a year, and Members of the Detective Department £5 a year in lieu of Clothing.

One Water Proof Coat or Cape will be issued to

each Member of the Force every fourth year.

Any additional article of Uniform required will be charged for at the undermentioned rates:-
