Human Remains Found.

Youndegin.—On the 6th February, 1884, there were some human remains found about 19 miles south of Youndegin Police Station, at a place called Nuckamoney; they appeared to have laid there about 6 months; there was no appearance of foul play. The remains are supposed to be those of William Renton, exp., late 4327, who was seen near where the remains were found in April last, and has not been seen since; the boots found on the remains have been identified as "Renton's."
