Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. ⁶/_{808.}—Some members of the Police Force having attempted to obtain promotion or transfer from one station to another by means of applications made by private friends, and such practices being injurious to the good order and discipline of the service, members of the Force are to understand that their prospects of promotion or transfer must depend on the report which their superiors may make as to their qualifications and conduct in the performance of their duties.

Merit and not favor is the ground of advancement, and any of the Police who attempt to bring interest to bear for the purpose of influencing the Commissioner to recommend them to His Excellency the Governor for promotion or transfer, will be considered disqualified for the promotion or transfer thus sought to be obtained.

GEO. PHILLIPS, Commissioner of Police. 17-5-87.

C.O. ⁶/₈₀₀.—When any of the Police are employed in plain clothes a report is to be made to the Commissioner of the cause of such employment, either at the time or as soon as possible afterwards. This is not to apply to the employment of Police who make enquiries in any case of crime in which it is considered they can be made more effectually by men in plain clothes, or to special cases of enquiry directed by the Commissioner.

Police on duty in plain clothes are distinctly to make known to any person who improperly interferes with them in the execution of their duty that they are Police Constables, and acting in the execution of their duty.

They must exercise their judgment as to the proper time to make the communication, so as not to interfere with the object they have in view, but at such a period that, if they were assaulted or resisted, the person assaulting or resisting them cannot plead ignorance of the real character of the Police, and of their duty.

There is no regulation of the service authorising the employment of Police in plain clothes, and by so doing two very important objects are lost sight of, namely, the prevention of crime by the presence—so that it is known—of a Constable, and the satisfaction to the public of seeing that a Constable is at the place.

Constables in plain clothes are not under the control of public observation, not being known from their dress to belong to the Police, and such a practice gives occasion to a charge of their being employed as spies, and in other improper ways.
