H IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that, after this date, the following additional Regulations with regard to Public Officers travelling on duty will come into force:—

- 1. It shall be the duty of the head of a Department, of the Colonial Secretary, and of the Auditor General, to report any cases coming under their notice in which the authorised scale of Subsistence allowance is manifestly excessive, in order that it may be considered whether the actual expenses proved to have been incurred by the officer travelling shall only be allowed.
- 2. For journeys between Perth, Fremantle, and Guildford a fixed allowance of Two shillings and sixpence will be made to officers proceeding to these places and returning the same day. This allowance will be in addition to any duly authorised railway fares.

The remains of a human being—conjectured to be those of the absconder John Gray, Reg.
