## Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O.  $\frac{10}{1900}$ .—Members of the Police Force are hereby directed to take immediate steps to have all stray dogs at all ports in the Colony, and within the City and Suburbs of Perth, dealt with under Section 12 of "The Dog Act, 1883."

This measure is required to assist in preventing the introduction of the Bubonic Plague into Western Australia.

The section in question provides that—"It shall be lawful for any person, at any place, to seize and detain any dog unattended and wandering at large, and upon notice thereof given to any Justice of the Peace, such Justice shall summon the owner to appear before him and claim such dog; and if such owner or some one on his behalf shall not within twenty-four hours after service of such summons, or within such further time as such Justice may deem reasonable, appear and claim such dog, the same shall be forthwith killed; and if any unregistered dog shall be found at large in any part of the Colony without being under the control of some person, any such dog so found at large shall be liable to be immediately killed and destroyed; and all persons are hereby authorised, and all constables specially or generally authorised in writing by a Justice of the Peace in that behalf, are ordered and required to seize, kill, and destroy every such dog so found at large accordingly."

- C.O. 14 One Members of the Police Force in charge of stations at which there are Government quarters provided, are required to observe the following instructions in order to minimise the risk from fire:-
