Police Long Service Medal, Jubilee 1897.

The Medals in gold and silver presented by the Government of Western Australia to Long Service Members of the Western Australian Police Force, on the occasion of the commemoration of the sixtieth year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, are, by permission, to be worn by the recipients within the Colony.

The gold medals were presented to Commissioned Officers, and the silver medals to Non-Commissioned Officers and Constables.

The medals are to be worn by the recipients on the centre of the left breast whenever they appear in full dress uniform, the top of the ribbon in line with the second button of the tunic.

The ribbon is blue in colour, and one inch in length.

With undress uniform the blue ribbon only, halfan-inch in length, is to be worn on the centre of the left breast in a line between the first and second buttons of the tunic.

The name, rank, and length of service of the recipient is engraved on the edge of the reverse side. Hereunder is a list of the recipients of the medals.
