#### Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O.  $\frac{20}{1901}$ .—The attention of the police throughout the State is drawn to C.O.  $\frac{8}{1901}$ :—

In many instances recently lengthy telegrams have been despatched from out stations to the Chief Office, and also from station to station, where a report by Post would have served the purpose just as well.

It is not necessary to advise me by wire of every trivial occurrence, such as a small fire, a suicide, a sudden death, or a man being lost in the bush. Of course, whenever the circumstances of the case make it advisable for the officer in charge to immediately solicit advice from Head Quarters, a rigid adherence to this order will not be exacted.

Common sense ought to guide the police in this matter; besides, it is explicitly laid down in the regulations that the telegraph is not to be used except when the exigencies of police duty or the efficiency of the service make such a means of communication imperative. In future it must be distinctly understood that any officer or constable contravening this order will be debited with the cost of the message so transmitted.
