#### CRIMINAL CHARGE RETURNS.

C.O. 49/1902.—Dating from the 1st January, 1903, the Charge Sheet and Crime Return in use in the Department will be cancelled and replaced by a Criminal Charge Return, Form A. (P. 44).

Supplies of these forms will be forwarded shortly to each district, together with a circular letter of instructions (Form F.) and a copy of the "Explanatory Notes" regarding the use of the Charge Cards and other forms to be used in connection with the new system adopted.

The completed cards must be forwarded regularly each month in the wrapper provided for the purpose direct to the Government Statistician, Perth, who will transmit them to the Detective Office.

Incomplete cards must be retained until all particulars are obtained; they will then be forwarded with the succeeding month's cards. Care should be taken to fasten the cards securely and to see that they are properly enclosed in the wrapper before being posted. Form E. must accompany each monthly despatch of Charge Returns.

Form B and Form D must also be supplied to the Government Statistician as required; whilst Form C. (General Annual Return) will be forwarded to the Inspector of Prisons.

The greatest care must be exercised in entering the necessary particulars in the Criminal Charge Returns, and in supplying the required information in the other forms referred to.

The Charge Book kept at each station will, of course, continue in use, as it will contain a record of the particulars supplied in the Charge Cards.
