The following maximum allowance will be granted to the police travelling on duty who are unable to return to their station within nine hours—provided they are necessarily absent not less than five hours.

(The 25 per cent. extra allowed on the Goldfields will also apply to this rate.)

Two-thirds of the above-named daily rates may be claimed by police absent on special duty from 12 to 16 hours. The full daily rate will be allowed to police absent on duty for twenty-four hours. In claiming for portion of a day over and above the twenty-four hours, one-fourth of the daily rate will be allowed for every six hours.

Plain Clothes Constables travelling on duty are entitled to draw the same subsistence allowance as detectives.

Members of the force, exclusive of District Officers, travelling on patrol or other duty (except gold escort) in the Western, Roebourne, and Kimberley Districts, where means of transport for rations, etc., are provided by the Department, cannot claim subsistence allowance if in receipt of ration allowance.

Members of the force proceeding to a station on temporary transfer, or on relief duty, will be entitled to subsistence allowance whilst en route to and from such station, and for a period not exceeding three weeks from date of arrival. Beyond that term the usual lodging and ration allowance only will be granted, except in the case of married men, who will continue to receive the subsistence allowance, less 25 per cent., during the remainder of the period temporarily absent from station.

The preceding clause will not apply to members of the force detailed for temporary transfer, or relief duty at the Suburban stations, in the Metropolitan, Fremantle, and East Coolgardie districts, within a radius of six miles from the head station. A special allowance of 3s. per day only will be granted for such duty.

TRAVELLING BEYOND STATE LIMITS.

Officers travelling on duty beyond the State limits will be entitled to the following rate of subsistence allowance:—

On Sea: Officers, 4s. 6d. per day; other grades, 2s. 6d. per day.

On Shore: 25 per cent. additional to the ordinary subsistence rates in the State. No allowance can be claimed otherwise by the police travelling by sea.

REFRESHMENT ALLOWANCE.

Police employed on duty at the courts, or in keeping observation, or following up offenders, etc., and unable to return to their homes for meals, will be entitled to claim the following allowance:—
