### TICKET OF LEAVE HOLDERS.

C.O.  $\frac{3}{3}\frac{7}{0}\frac{3}{0}$ .—It is desired by the Sheriff and Inspector of Prisons that where it is known to the police that a Ticket of Leave holder is endeavouring to obtain an honest livelihood, he should not be interfered with for committing any trifling breach of the Ticket of Leave Regulations.

Should a Ticket of Leave holder be arrested for any breach of the Regulations, he should be taken before the nearest magistrate to be dealt with, except it is found necessary to remand him to another district for the purpose of having the charge heard.

C.O.  $\frac{3}{1903}$ .—In various districts of the State it is customary for the police to receive payment of fees for service of Police Court summonses from the Clerk of Petty Sessions. The practice, however, is irregular, and must at once cease. The only fees for service of summonses by the police and mileage are those provided in the fifth schedule of "The Justices' Act, 1902," and on collection these must be paid to the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

District officers will, in future, therefore, be careful to see that all such fees are dealt with in the manner prescribed.

# REGULATIONS UNDER "THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895."

1. Every person, being the owner of, or the agent of the owner of, or in possession or charge of any swine within any part of the State, shall, for the space of six weeks immediately following the 29th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and three, being the date of the publication of these Regulations in the Government Gazette, confine and keep confined such swine strictly within the boundaries of the premises whereon such swine shall be.

- 2. No person shall remove, or permit or suffer to be removed, any swine from such premises during such period of six weeks.
- 3. Every person being the owner of, or the agent of the owner of, or in possession or charge of any infected swine, or any swine suspected of being infected, shall, within twenty-four hours after he shall have discovered or suspected, or should have discovered or suspected such swine to be infected, give notice in writing thereof to an Inspector, and shall keep such swine from coming into contact with any other swine until the Inspector shall otherwise order.

Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five hundred pounds.
