Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. $\frac{9}{1804}$.—It has been pointed out by the Crown Law Department that in districts where no Resident Magistrate is located inquests have occasionally been held by Honorary Justices, which were quite unnecessary.

It is requested therefore that in future cases the police, should as far as possible, confer with the Clerk of Courts before applying to a Justice for an inquest. In most cases, doubtless the Clerk of Courts and the Police would be able to agree as to the necessity for an inquest, but should they have any doubt in the matter a communication by wire should be despatched to the R.M., briefly stating the facts, and if he considered the inquest necessary the Justice could be asked to preside.

The circumstances in any case, however, must be reported in the usual way.
