### Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

#### UNIFORM.

C.O.  $\frac{1+\sigma}{1+\sigma}$ .—A new system will be adopted in future in regard to the supply of Uniform Clothing, so as to insure the summer and winter uniform being issued and brought into use on fixed dates.

In accordance with the new method, the summer uniform will be issued from the Police Store during September (beginning with next September) and members of the force will commence to wear same on the 1st October. The winter uniform will be likewise issued during April and must be worn on and after the 1st May. Helmets, macintoshes and great coats will be issued as heretofore.

A complete list of all members of the force entitled to summer uniform, in each district, must be at once forwarded to Chief Office, accompanied by accurate measurements on the prescribed form. The lists should also specify whether a man is employed on foot or mounted duty, and as far as practicable the disposition of the force in this respect, in the respective districts, should not be altered without sufficient reason.

The lists will continue to be forwarded half-yearly, on the 1st November and 1st May respectively, with fresh measurements in each instance.

The usual requisitions for uniform will not therefore be necessary in future.

In forwarding the list now required it should be stated if any member of the force is in urgent need of uniform for immediate wear.

These instructions apply to all districts with the exception of Roebourne and Kimberley.
