His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following amendment to the Rules and Regulations for the West Australian Police Benefit Fund, framed under the provisions of 30 Victoria, No. 10, and 48 Victoria, No. 18, and dated the 4th day of January, 1898.

 - (a.) Where a member of the Police Force is appointed Bailiff of a Local Court, with the approval of the Commissioner, he will be at liberty to receive all fees, mileage,

etc., payable to Bailiffs, and to retain the same, provided he finds his own mode of conveyance.

(b.) Where no Bailiff is available, members of the Police Force are directed to serve summonses or other process of a Local Court, but all fees, mileage, etc., shall be paid to the Police Benefit Fund.


