C.O. 1100.—The attention of District Officers is again directed to the necessity for exercising the strictest economy in regard to expenditure in their respective districts for the remainder of the financial year.

The ordinary patrols, particularly in the agricultural districts of the State, which appear to be undertaken in many instances as a matter of course, must in future be restricted wherever it can prudently be done. The Police should only be despatched on such duty in the event of a complaint, or where their presence is absolutely essential.

Generally, I look to the co-operation of District Officers and officers in charge of stations in effecting a reduction in police expenditure throughout the State wherever it is found practicable to do so.




