C.O. $\frac{21}{1005}$.—The following extract from a minute of the Assistant Crown Solicitor, dated the 6th June, 1905, in connection with an application to the Chief Justice in Chambers for the release on bail of one Cadwallader, charged with incest, and under remand, is published for the information and guidance of the police, generally :—

His Honour the Chief Justice dismissed the application, and decided not to interfere at the present juncture, at the same time he requested me to convey to the Police that he holds the view that in all cases where a person is charged with an indictable offence by the Police, and a remand is desired, the English practice should be followed, and some evidence, even if only of a formal nature, should be taken.

In most cases it would be sufficient to call the arresting constable, and to prove that the accused is lawfully in custody in order to obtain a first remand.

Speaking for myself I have always been of the opinion that Justices are not warranted in granting even a first remand without evidence to satisfy themselves that the accused is in lawful custody. However, it is not of my own motion, but in order to comply with His Honour's direction that I address this communication to you, in order that you may, if you think right, communicate His Honour's expression of opinion to the Uniform Police and the Detective Branch.
