

THE EARLY CLOSING ACT.

C.O. 25/1905.—Referring to C.O. 24/1903, the following instructions in regard to the enforcement of the provisions of the Early Closing Act have been approved, and are published for the information and guidance of the police in future:—

- (I.) That in districts to which the Early Closing Act has been applied, the police generally (without having any specified officers appointed) are to carry out the duties of Inspectors under the Act.
- (2.) Before taking proceedings the police to report all breaches to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Perth. Except when, for special reasons, the Factories Department desire to take action, all prosecutions to be taken by the police, and result of such actions to be recorded in the office of the Chief Inspector of Factories.
- (3.) The police in the district affected will be advised from time to time (monthly) of any exempted shops, or of any matter affecting the enforcement of the Act in that district.
- (4.) Copies of the Act, Regulations, and all necessary forms will be supplied to the police as required.
- (5.) Dealings in matters affecting the Early Closing Act to be direct between the Chief Inspector, Perth, and the District Officer concerned.
