



Special Inquiry.

Murder of Michael Naughton at Cue on June 10th, 1906.

The result of the post-mortem examination shows that death was caused by a bullet from a '32 calibre firearm, rifled in four grooves, probably an imitation Smith & Wesson, or some other cheap central fire revolver.


