## POLICE GAOLS.

C.O. <sup>19</sup>/<sub>1907</sub>.—Referring to Circular Order No. 19 of the 12th of May, 1902, Keepers of Police Gaols are notified that where there is a Government Contractor the rations for Prisoners *serving their sentences in Police Gaols* are to be obtained from that Contractor, and all claims rendered in his name and in accordance with scheduled prices; where there is no Contractor, the "current ruling prices of the local market" will be allowed for such rations, but all claims must be rendered in the name of the person from whom the rations are purchased. Claims rendered in the name of the Gaol Keeper, unless previously sanctioned by the Comptroller General, will not be passed. In both cases the claims must be signed by the Gaol Keeper as the "Officer incurring the expense." Except meat and bread, the items mentioned in the Ration Scale may be purchased in small bulk—say a week's supply.
