Duties of Officers in charge of Districts and Sub-Districts.

C.O. ⁶/₍₂₀₎.—It is of great importance that the Government should have immediate and reliable intelligence of every occurrence of an unusual character, more especially those affecting the public peace, casualties to shipping, &c. If therefore any newspaper or other public account of an occurrence of a serious or important nature shall reach Perth before the Police report of it reaches the Commissioner, the Officer in charge of the District or Sub-District in which the occurrence took place will be deemed guilty of neglect of duty, unless he can satisfactorily explain the delay.
