Bank Robbery.—£200 Reward.

Stolen from Alfred Haysom, in the Commercial Bank, Adelaide, about 2.50 p.m., 31st ultimo, £2636 all in Commercial Bank notes, Adelaide register, made up as follows, and the property of Cornelius Proud:—43 £50 notes, 6 £20, 25 £10, 23 £5, and 1 £1 note.

Haysom had placed the bundle of notes with other money, on the bank counter; a man, of whom he took no notice, told him that he had dropped some money on the floor.
