MURDER AT NARBETHONG.

£200 Reward for arrest of William Colston.

Whereas on Saturday, the 21st February last, a man named William Davies and his wife, Mary E. Davies, were found brutally murdered near Narbethong: and whereas a man named William Colston was the last person seen in William Davies' company on or about the 20th February: Notice is hereby given that a reward of £200 will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the said William Colston. William Colston left Narbethong on the 21st February, and was last seen at Marysville on the same date. He was at one time employed as a ship's carpenter, and may perhaps endeavor to make for some sea-port town in one of the neighboring colonies. His description is as follows: native of Bristol, England, about 40 years old, 5ft. 7½in. high, fresh complexion, hazel eyes, well built, broad shoulders, short sandy beard, whiskers, and moustache, brown hair with bald spot on back of head, slight scratch on side of face, small feet, has two crossed flags on lower left forearm; wore dark brownish coat, dark tweed trousers, and new soft drab hat. Has been working as a carpenter. Served six years in Royal Engineers and five in N.S.W. Artillery.
