When a Public Creditor wishes to have the authority at the foot of the Account signed by an agent or representative, it will be necessary for him to lodge with the Treasury an authority to that effect, otherwise the signature will be useless.

Where a Signature is by mark it will be necessary, in all cases, to have it witnessed.
