Murder.

On the 13th inst., the body of a man, a European, name unknown, was found buried at a place known as Theodolite, near Broad Arrow, Coolgardie Goldfield.

At a *post-mortem* examination of deceased a wound, apparently made by a pick, was found at the back of deceased's head.

An inquest was held on the 16th inst., and a verdict returned of "Wilful murder by some person or persons unknown."

Suspicion is attached to a man who was seen on the 12th inst., working near the spot where deceased was found. He has since disappeared, and no trace of him has yet been obtained. He is described as stout build, weight about 13 stone, walks erect as if drilled, height about 6ft., aged about 34 years, fair complexion, clean shaved, except fair moustache, not heavy but fairly long, a German or Swede, but speaks good English. When last seen he was dressed in light coloured mole or cord trousers well fitted, light shirt, no coat, light coloured soft felt hat, with small brim, boots heel-tipped and toe-plated, nailed soles with three rows in centre, and two rows around edges, size 9.

He is believed to have passed through Coolgardie last week on his way towards the coast, and will probably endeavour to leave the Colony.

The following is a description of the murdered man:—Height 5ft. 10in., age from 40 to 45 years, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair turning grey, inclined to be bald, moustache and whiskers turning grey, moustache cropped square, and whiskers cropped close, good front teeth, double canine tooth out of upper jaw, several back teeth missing, tumour of long standing on right shoulder, penile amputation one inch from pubis; wore striped moleskin trousers with canvas patch on right knee, pepper-andsalt tweed vest, coarse woollen drawers, and socks of a grey colour, flannellette shirt (check pattern), white under-flannel, drab soft felt hat, leather strap round waist, having sheath knife and leather pouch attached, latter containing Waterbury watch tied with piece of string in lieu of guard, also tin matchbox and pocket-knife with two blades, nailed boots with heel plates, two rows of nails in centre and two rows on edge of soles, size 9.

Murder.

On the 13th inst., the body of a man, a European, name unknown, was found buried at a place known as Theodolite, near Broad Arrow, Coolgardie Goldfield.

At a *post-mortem* examination of deceased a wound, apparently made by a pick, was found at the back of deceased's head.

An inquest was held on the 16th inst., and a verdict returned of "Wilful murder by some person or persons unknown."

Suspicion is attached to a man who was seen on the 12th inst., working near the spot where deceased was found. He has since disappeared, and no trace of him has yet been obtained. He is described as stout build, weight about 13 stone, walks erect as if drilled, height about 6ft., aged about 34 years, fair complexion, clean shaved, except fair moustache, not heavy but fairly long, a German or Swede, but speaks good English. When last seen he was dressed in light coloured mole or cord trousers well fitted, light shirt, no coat, light coloured soft felt hat, with small brim, boots heel-tipped and toe-plated, nailed soles with three rows in centre, and two rows around edges, size 9.

He is believed to have passed through Coolgardie last week on his way towards the coast, and will probably endeavour to leave the Colony.

The following is a description of the murdered man:-Height 5ft. 10in., age from 40 to 45 years, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair turning grey, inclined to be bald, moustache and whiskers turning grey, moustache cropped square, and whiskers cropped close, good front teeth, double canine tooth out of upper jaw, several back teeth missing, tumour of long standing on right shoulder, penile amputation one inch from pubis; wore striped moleskin trousers with canvas patch on right knee, pepper-andsalt tweed vest, coarse woollen drawers, and socks of a grey colour, flannellette shirt (check pattern), white under-flannel, drab soft felt hat, leather strap round waist, having sheath knife and leather pouch attached, latter containing Waterbury watch tied with piece of string in lieu of guard, also tin matchbox and pocket-knife with two blades, nailed boots with heel plates, two rows of nails in centre and two rows on edge of soles, size 9.

Murder.

On the 13th inst., the body of a man, a European, name unknown, was found buried at a place known as Theodolite, near Broad Arrow, Coolgardie Goldfield.

At a *post-mortem* examination of deceased a wound, apparently made by a pick, was found at the back of deceased's head.

An inquest was held on the 16th inst., and a verdict returned of "Wilful murder by some person or persons unknown."

Suspicion is attached to a man who was seen on the 12th inst., working near the spot where deceased was found. He has since disappeared, and no trace of him has yet been obtained. He is described as stout build, weight about 13 stone, walks erect as if drilled, height about 6ft., aged about 34 years, fair complexion, clean shaved, except fair moustache, not heavy but fairly long, a German or Swede, but speaks good English. When last seen he was dressed in light coloured mole or cord trousers well fitted, light shirt, no coat, light coloured soft felt hat, with small brim, boots heel-tipped and toe-plated, nailed soles with three rows in centre, and two rows around edges, size 9.

He is believed to have passed through Coolgardie last week on his way towards the coast, and will probably endeavour to leave the Colony.

The following is a description of the murdered man:—Height 5ft. 10in., age from 40 to 45 years, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair turning grey, inclined to be bald, moustache and whiskers turning grey, moustache cropped square, and whiskers cropped close, good front teeth, double canine tooth out of upper jaw, several back teeth missing, tumour of long standing on right shoulder, penile amputation one inch from pubis; wore striped moleskin trousers with canvas patch on right knee, pepper-andsalt tweed vest, coarse woollen drawers, and socks of a grey colour, flannellette shirt (check pattern), white under-flannel, drab soft felt hat, leather strap round waist, having sheath knife and leather pouch attached, latter containing Waterbury watch tied with piece of string in lieu of guard, also tin matchbox and pocket-knife with two blades, nailed boots with heel plates, two rows of nails in centre and two rows on edge of soles, size 9.

Murder.

On the 13th inst., the body of a man, a European, name unknown, was found buried at a place known as Theodolite, near Broad Arrow, Coolgardie Goldfield.

At a *post-mortem* examination of deceased a wound, apparently made by a pick, was found at the back of deceased's head.

An inquest was held on the 16th inst., and a verdict returned of "Wilful murder by some person or persons unknown."

Suspicion is attached to a man who was seen on the 12th inst., working near the spot where deceased was found. He has since disappeared, and no trace of him has yet been obtained. He is described as stout build, weight about 13 stone, walks erect as if drilled, height about 6ft., aged about 34 years, fair complexion, clean shaved, except fair moustache, not heavy but fairly long, a German or Swede, but speaks good English. When last seen he was dressed in light coloured mole or cord trousers well fitted, light shirt, no coat, light coloured soft felt hat, with small brim, boots heel-tipped and toe-plated, nailed soles with three rows in centre, and two rows around edges, size 9.

He is believed to have passed through Coolgardie last week on his way towards the coast, and will probably endeavour to leave the Colony.

The following is a description of the murdered man:—Height 5ft. 10in., age from 40 to 45 years, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair turning grey, inclined to be bald, moustache and whiskers turning grey, moustache cropped square, and whiskers cropped close, good front teeth, double canine tooth out of upper jaw, several back teeth missing, tumour of long standing on right shoulder, penile amputation one inch from pubis; wore striped moleskin trousers with canvas patch on right knee, pepper-andsalt tweed vest, coarse woollen drawers, and socks of a grey colour, flannellette shirt (check pattern), white under-flannel, drab soft felt hat, leather strap round waist, having sheath knife and leather pouch attached, latter containing Waterbury watch tied with piece of string in lieu of guard, also tin matchbox and pocket-knife with two blades, nailed boots with heel plates, two rows of nails in centre and two rows on edge of soles, size 9.
