Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. ¹⁵/₉₅.—District Officers and Sub-district Officers will issue such instructions to Police under their charge as will ensure that a proper record is kept of the movements of Ticket-of-Leave Holders and Conditional Release Holders in their respective Districts.

In future the removal or Transfer of a Ticket-of-Leave or Conditional Release Holder from one District to another is to be notified to Detective Office, Perth, as well as to the Officer in charge of the District to which such removal or transfer is made.

District Officers and Sub-district Officers will see that the instructions therein are fully observed by Police under their control.

"C.O.6/665.—The Superintendent finds it necessary again to have to notice that, while reports of occurrences from some of the Police Stations in the Colony are of an intelligent nature, others contain a very meagre amount of information.

He wishes to impress on the members of the Police Force that the records in these reports are not supposed to be confined solely to what takes place at the Station building, but to include also what takes place in the locality. For instance, the arrivals and departures of persons, the movements of the criminal classes, reports of articles lost or found, inquests, accidents, affrays, meetings and their object, public entertainments, openings of new inns, stores, or manufactories, and by whom; in country places, state of roads, complaints by settlers and others, manner in which public houses are kept, &c., &c. Any occurrence that requires a special report should be recorded in the occurrence sheets shortly with the words "see Special Report" added.

It is impossible to enumerate all the heads of intelligence that should be reported in the occurrence sheets, but their object is to keep the Head of the Police thoroughly posted up in what is taking place all over the Colony.

No idle gossip is to be entered-nothing but what is authentic.

The manner in which occurrence sheets are filled up at different stations is an index in a great measure to the intelligence of the officers or constables in charge and to the interest they take in their work, in getting possession of information and knowing what is going on, and a test of their fitness for the charge of a station.

Many an occurrence, apparently at the time of no importance, such for instance as the passing at a certain time in a certain locality of a suspected person or of any person in a suspicious manner, may lead, if noted, to the detection of a crime.

In towns it is the duty of all constables to report everything that may come under their notice, so that the reports of occurrences may be compiled in a complete manner."
