WARRANTS.

C.O. $\frac{6}{9.6}$.—District Officers and Sub.-District Officers are instructed that in future a Warrant Book will be kept at every Police Station. The Warrant Book at each station is to contain the full particulars of every warrant that passes through the hands of police at that station, from whom received, time and date received, and such remarks as are necessary to explain the action taken thereon, or, as to the disposal of the warrant.

Every warrant issued for any person suspected of being about to quit the Colony, and which police have failed to execute, should be forwarded to the Officer in Charge of Detectives at Perth, to be filed in his office, from which it can be easily obtained when required.

Every other warrant should, as a rule, be filed in the office of the Officer in Charge of the District in which it issued, and should never be allowed to remain in another district or at any other station in

the same district, unless with the prospect of its early execution, or for some other special reason.

All warrants issued in Perth Police District should, failing early execution, be deposited and filed in the office of the Officer in Charge of Detectives, Perth, whence they can be obtained at any time.

In the event of an arrest requiring the production of the warrant application should be made to the officer of the district in which it issued, or to the officer in charge of detectives, Perth.

In criminal matters so much may depend upon the production of a warrant that the greatest care must be exercised by police in the transmission, registration, and filing of all warrants that come into their hands.

Justices having declined to admit copy affidavits as evidence in support of claims made under "The Absconding Debtors Act, 1877" (41 Vie., No. 17), unless bearing the signature of the Justice before whom the original affidavit was made, police officers when receiving a warrant issued under this Act will request to be furnished with a sufficient number of certified copies of the affidavit countersigned by the Justice who received the original, as will admit of one certified copy being supplied to the police at each port, and one to Detective Office, Perth.
